

# ALBERTA REGULATION 82/97

## Environmental Protection and Enhancement Act

### LUBRICATING OIL MATERIAL RECYCLING AND MANAGEMENT REGULATION

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<b>Definitions</b>	<b>1</b>	In this Regulation,
		(a) "Act" means the <i>Environmental Protection and Enhancement Act</i> ;
		(b) "Association" means the Alberta Used Oil Management Association;
		(c) "by-law" means a by-law made by the Association under section 8;
		(d) "end user" means a person who purchases and uses lubricating oil material or equipment containing lubricating oil for its intended use;
		(e) "filter" means any spin-on or element style fluid filter that is used in hydraulic or internal combustion engine applications, but does not include a gasoline fuel filter;
		(f) "lubricating oil" means petroleum-derived or synthetic crankcase oil, engine oil, hydraulic fluid, transmission fluid, gear oil, heat transfer fluid or other oil or fluid used for lubricating purposes in machinery or equipment;

- (g) "lubricating oil material" means lubricating oil, oil containers and filters;
- (h) "Minister" means the Minister of Environment;
- (i) "oil container" means a container in which lubricating oil is supplied and that has a capacity of 30 litres or less;
- (j) "supplier" means
  - (i) a manufacturer of lubricating oil material who supplies the manufacturer's own brand of lubricating oil material to

- (A) a jobber,

- (B) a retailer, or

- (C) the end user;

- (ii) a marketer who supplies lubricating oil material to

- (A) a jobber,

- (B) a retailer, or

- (C) the end user,

where the lubricating oil material was manufactured for the marketer by another person and the marketer owns the brand;

- (iii) a marketer who supplies lubricating oil material to

- (A) a jobber,

- (B) a retailer, or

- (C) the end user,

where the lubricating oil material was manufactured for the marketer by another person and the marketer is the licensee of the brand;

- (iv) a wholesaler, including a retail distributor, who supplies lubricating oil material to

- (A) a jobber,

- (B) a retailer, or

- (C) the end user;

(v) a jobber who supplies lubricating oil material that the jobber has imported into Alberta to

(A) a retailer, or

(B) the end user;

(vi) a retailer who supplies to the end user lubricating oil material that the retailer has imported into Alberta;

(vii) a wholesale equipment supplier who supplies equipment to

(A) its dealers, or

(B) the end user of the equipment,

where, as part of the transaction, lubricating oil material is also supplied;

(k) "supply" means a sale or other transfer.

**Designated material**

**2** Lubricating oil material is hereby designated as designated material for the purposes of Part 9, Division 1 of the Act.

**Management board established**

**3** The Alberta Used Oil Management Association, being a society incorporated under the Societies Act, is hereby established as a management board within the meaning of section 175(jj) of the Act.

**Freedom of information and protection of privacy**

**3.1(1)** The Association shall comply with the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* in the course of carrying out its powers, duties and functions under this Regulation.

(2) The Association shall designate a person to be responsible for freedom of information matters.

(3) If a request for access to information pursuant to *the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* is made, the Association shall,

(a) in the case of a request made directly to the Association, immediately direct the request to the Department's Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Co-ordinator, and

(b) in every case, comply with such directions regarding the request as may be provided by the Co-ordinator.

- (4) All records in the custody or under the control of the Association that are required in the carrying out of its powers, duties or functions under this Regulation are subject to
  - (a) the Records Management Regulation (AR 57/95), or
  - (b) any regulation that replaces the Records Management Regulation (AR 57/95).
- (5) All information and records created or maintained in the course of carrying out the powers, duties and functions under this Regulation become and remain the property of the Crown in right of Alberta.
- (6) The Association shall designate a person to be responsible for records management matters.

**Annual  
report**

- 4(1) The Association shall
  - (a) not less than 30 days before the start of each fiscal year provide to the Minister a business plan for the Association that indicates its goals for the coming fiscal year, and
  - (b) not more than 6 months after the end of each fiscal year provide to the Minister an annual report summarizing the activities of the Association and containing the audited financial statements of the Association for the fiscal year.
- (2) The remuneration and benefits that were paid to
  - (a) all members of the board of directors of the Association, and
  - (b) all management personnel who report directly to one or more of the members of the board of directors during the fiscal year must be reported in the financial statements or as a note or schedule to the financial statements.
- (3) The remuneration and benefits must be reported
  - (a) on an individual basis by name in the case of the persons referred to in subsection (2)(a), and
  - (b) on an aggregate basis in the case of the persons referred to in subsection (2)(b).

(4) The Minister is authorized to disclose personal information reported under this section, and this subsection constitutes an authorization for the purposes of section 40(1)(f) of the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act.

- Registration**      **5(1)**    Every
- (a) supplier, and
  - (b) end user who imports lubricating oil material into Alberta for the end user's own business use
- shall apply to the Association to be registered.
- (2) An application referred to in subsection (1) shall be made in the form and manner prescribed in the by-laws.
- Cancellation and suspension of registration**      **6(1)**    The Association may cancel or suspend the registration of a registrant if the registrant contravenes the Act, this Regulation or the by-laws.
- (2) The Association may cancel the registration of a registrant if the registrant ceases to carry on business or applies to surrender his certificate of registration.
- (3) A person who ceases to be a registrant by virtue of subsection (1) or (2) or whose certificate of registration is under suspension shall forthwith surrender the certificate of registration to the Association.
- Prohibition**      **7**      No person shall act as a supplier or as an end user within the meaning of section 5(1) unless the person is registered and the registration is not under suspension
- By-laws**      **8(1)**    The Association may make by-laws
- (a) classifying lubricating oil material for the purposes of the by-laws;
  - (b) providing for the establishment, operation and winding-up by the Association of an industry operated recycling fund in respect of lubricating oil materials, including, without limitation, by-laws
    - (i) prescribing the manner in which and the purposes for which money in the fund may be used;

- (ii) providing for the imposition of surcharges by the Association in respect of transactions in lubricating oil materials by registrants and providing for all matters related to the payment of those surcharges and the collection of them by the Association, including without limitation,
    - (A) prescribing the amounts of the surcharges and prescribing which registrant or class of registrant must pay, collect and remit the surcharges,
    - (B) governing the reports and returns to the Association that must be made by registrants,
    - (C) providing for interest charges on late payment of the surcharges, and
    - (D) providing for the assessment by the Association of surcharge amounts owing;
  - (c) governing registration of registrants, including prescribing the amount of any registration fee;
  - (d) requiring an applicant for registration or a registrant
    - (i) to provide security to the Association, or
    - (ii) to provide to the Association evidence of security in a form and amount that is acceptable to the Association for the purpose of ensuring that the applicant or registrant exercises the powers and carries out the duties of registrant in accordance with the Act, this Regulation and the by-laws;
  - (e) protecting the confidentiality of information provided by applicants for registration and registrants;
  - (f) respecting the keeping of records by registrants in respect of transactions in lubricating oil material, and the making of those records available for inspection by the Association and representatives of the Department of Environment;
  - (g) exempting supply transactions from any or all of the requirements of the by-laws;
  - (h) respecting any other matter related to the administration of this Regulation by the Association.
- (2) The Regulations Act applies to by-laws under subsection (1).

**Notice to Minister**      **9**      Where the Association proposes to change its objects or by-laws under the Societies Act, it shall give reasonable prior notice of the nature of the proposed changes to the Minister.

**Offence**      **10**      A person who contravenes section 6(3) or 7 is guilty of an offence and liable to a fine of not more than

(a) \$50 000 in the case of an individual, or

(b) \$500 000 in the case of a corporation.

### **Expiry**

**Expiry**      **11**      For the purpose of ensuring that this Regulation is reviewed for ongoing relevancy and necessity, with the option that it may be re-passed in its present or an amended form following a review, this Regulation expires on June 30, 2009.

**Coming into force**      **12(1)**      This Regulation, except section 7, comes into force on the date on which it is filed.

(2) Section 7 comes into force on July 1, 1997.

## APPENDIX

### Environmental Protection and Enhancement Act

#### LUBRICATING OIL MATERIAL RECYCLING AND MANAGEMENT BY-LAW

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- Definitions**
- 1(1)** In this By-law,
- (a) "calendar quarter" means a period of 3 months beginning on the first day of January, April, July or October in each calendar year;
  - (b) "environmental handling charge" means the environmental handling charge referred to in section 5;
  - (c) "Fund" means the Lubricating Oil Material Recycling and Management Fund;
  - (d) "process oil" means oil that is not recoverable because it is fully consumed in a process or is incorporated in another product;
  - (e) "registrant" means a supplier or end user who is registered under section 5 of the regulation;
  - (f) "regulation" means the *Lubricating Oil Material Recycling and Management Regulation*.
- (2)** Terms that are defined in the regulation have the same meaning when they are used in this By-law.

**Recycling  
fund  
established**

**2 (1)** There is hereby established an industry operated recycling fund to be called the "Lubricating Oil Material Recycling and Management Fund", which shall be used to provide or pay for any or all of the following:

- (a) establishing and administering a lubricating oil material waste minimization, recycling and management program;
- (b) education programs for the purpose of the lubricating oil material waste minimization, recycling and management program;
- (c) expenditures incurred in the collection, transportation, storage, processing and disposal of lubricating oil material;
- (d) research and development activities related to lubricating oil material management;
- (e) promotion and development for marketing the products of lubricating oil material recycling.

**(2)** The following shall be deposited into the Fund:

- (a) environmental handling charges on lubricating oil material, as provided for in this By-law;
- (b) gifts, donations and bequests to the Fund.

**(3)** Investment income earned on deposits of the Fund accrues to and forms part of the Fund.

**(4)** Salaries, fees, costs, expenses and liabilities incurred in the administration of the Fund shall be paid out of the Fund.

**(5)** The Association shall administer the Fund in accordance with the Act, the regulation and this By-law.

**Registration**

**3 (1)** An application for registration by a person referred to in section 5 of the regulation must be in a form acceptable to or provided by the Association and must contain the information required by the Association.

**(2)** The registration fee to be paid by an applicant for registration is \$200.

**(3)** If the Association registers an applicant it shall assign a registration number and issue a certificate of registration to the registrant and shall notify the registrant in writing of the number and the effective date of registration.

- Security**                    4            The Association may require an applicant for registration or a registrant
- (a)        to provide security to the Association, or
  - (b)        to provide to the Association evidence of security in a form and amount that is acceptable to the Association for the purpose of ensuring that the applicant or registrant exercises the powers and carries out the duties as registrant in accordance with the Act, the regulation and this Bylaw.
- Environment Handling Charge**            5 (1)    A registrant who, being a supplier, supplies lubricating oil material through any of the transactions described in section 1(j) of the regulation shall levy and collect as a surcharge from the person to whom the lubricating oil material is supplied an environmental handling charge in the amount prescribed for that class of lubricating oil material by by-law of the Association.
- (2)        A registrant who, being an end user, imports lubricating oil material into Alberta for the end user's own business use shall pay to the Association as a surcharge an environmental handling charge in the amount prescribed for that class of lubricating oil material by by-law of the Association.
- (3)        No environmental handling charge shall be levied or paid in the case of a transaction for the following types of lubricating oil:
- (a)        two-cycle oil;
  - (b)        chain oil;
  - (c)        rockdrill oil;
  - (d)        marine oil;
  - (e)        metal working oil;
  - (f)        saw guide oil used to cool and lubricate cutting operations;
  - (g)        waylube oil used to lubricate metal machining operations;
  - (h)        textile oil used to lubricate sewing needles.
- (4)        Subsection (3) does not exempt the oil container in which the lubricating oil is contained.

- (5) It is the intent of this By-law that the environmental handling charge in respect of a particular lubricating oil material be levied or paid only once.

**Return and payment of environmental handling charge**

- 6 (1) A registrant shall
  - (a) complete and file with the Association at its head office a return in respect of each reporting period not later than 30 days after the end of the reporting period, and
  - (b) remit to the Association with the return all environmental handling charges the registrant has collected or for which the registrant is liable under section 5 during the reporting period.
- (2) A return shall be in a form acceptable to the Association.
- (3) Unless the Association directs otherwise, the reporting period for the purposes of this section is a calendar quarter.
- (4) The Association may in writing at any time extend the time for filing a return.

**Assessments**

- 7 (1) Where
  - (a) a registrant fails to file a return in accordance with section 6, or
  - (b) the Association reasonably believes that a return that has been filed is incorrect or misleading, the Association may assess the amount of environmental handling charges to be remitted by the registrant in respect of the reporting period.
- (2) Where a registrant fails to collect or remit an environmental handling charge during a reporting period, the Association may assess the environmental handling charge in an amount equal to the amount of the environmental handling charge that the registrant failed to collect or remit.
- (3) Where the Association makes an assessment under subsection (1) or (2), the registrant shall remit
  - (a) the amount of the assessment, or
  - (b) where a return has been filed and a remittance made, the amount, if any, by which the amount of the assessment exceeds the amount remitted, and the remittance is due and payable from the time the person receives notice of the assessment.

<b>Interests</b>	<b>8</b>	Interest is payable by a registrant on environmental handling charges that the registrant fails to remit as required by this By-law, and is payable at the rate of 1% per month, compounded at a rate of 12.68% per year, from the date the unpaid amount is due until the amount is paid.
<b>Charges In Trust</b>	<b>9</b>	A registrant holds all environmental handling charges referred to in section 5 in trust for the Association.
<b>Recovery of Charge</b>	<b>10</b>	An environmental handling charge and any interest owing in respect of it are recoverable by the Association in an action in debt.
<b>Records</b>	<b>11</b>	<p>A registrant shall</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(a) keep records of the registrant's transactions in lubricating oil material and of the amount of the applicable environmental handling charge,</li><li>(b) make those records available<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(i) for inspection by the Association and representatives of the Department of Environment, and</li><li>(ii) for audit at the times and by a person designated by the Association, and</li></ul></li><li>(c) provide to the Association on request information in respect of the registrant's transactions in lubricating oil material.</li></ul>
<b>Confidentiality</b>	<b>12</b>	Where the Association or a representative of the Department of Environment acquires information under this By-law from a registrant and the information relates to a trade secret, process or technique that the registrant providing the information keeps confidential, the Association or the representative, as the case may be, shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that the information is not used or released in a form or manner that is likely to undermine the confidentiality.
<b>Repeal</b>	<b>13</b>	The <i>Lubricating Oil Material Recycling and Management By-law (AR 141/97)</i> is repealed.

#### LUBRICATING OIL MATERIAL ENVIRONMENTAL HANDLING CHARGE BY-LAW

- Definitions**      **1** Terms that are defined in the *Lubricating Oil Material Recycling and Management Regulation* (AR 82/97) have the same meaning when used in this By-law.
- Handling charge**      **2** The following environmental handling charges are prescribed for the following lubricating oil materials for the purposes of section 5(2) of the *Lubricating Oil Material Recycling and Management By-law*:
- (a) for lubricating oil, \$0.05 per litre or per kilogram;
  - (b) for lubricating oil containers, \$0.05 per litre of container size;
  - (c) for filters, \$0.50 for a filter less than 203 mm in length, and \$1 for a filter 203 mm or more in length.
- Repeal**      **3** The *Lubricating Oil Material Environmental Handling Charge By-law* (AR 160/97) is repealed.

Filters - \$0.50/filter for all sump type transmission filters, \$0.50/filter for other filters < 8 inches (203 mm) or \$1.00/filter for => 8 inches (203 mm).
