

Used Lubricating Products Stewardship Plan

Overview of MARRC

The Manitoba Association for Resource Recovery Corp. (MARRC) is a non-profit corporation established in 1997 by manufacturers and marketers of lubricating products in Manitoba . Its mandate is to develop, implement and administer a cost-effective, sustainable, user-financed, province-wide stewardship program for used oil, used oil filters and used oil containers.

Northern Opportunities

Objective: To develop and implement a plan to facilitate the removal of used lubricating products through the establishment of a network of collection depots in the north.

While MARRC will neither own nor operate the depots, it is prepared to share in supporting the activities required.

◆ Depot owner/operators will be responsible for the following:

◆ Licenced approved site

◆ Licenced (ULC) approved storage

◆ Ability to collect all 3 streams

- Used oil
- Used oil filters
- Used oil containers

◆ Staffing

◆ Record Keeping

◆ Insurance

◆ MARRC's Support

- ◆ MARRC is prepared to fund one half (50%) of the capital investment to a maximum of $(6000 \times 50\%)$ \$3,000.
- ◆ MARRC will also provide operating support based on an approved budget to a maximum of \$2,000.
- ◆ MARRC will provide a 10% return on investment to owner.

- ◆ The operating licence from Manitoba Conservation will require the staff to be effectively trained on procedures pertaining to the operation of the facility along with certification under the Transportation of Dangerous Goods Regulation.

MARRC will cover the costs of training which will require 2 days to complete at a central location.

- ◆ MARRC will provide educational and promotional material for the owner/operator in the form of Newsletters and Brochures.
